

## **Fight against Hate Poster Competition**

## What is Hate?



A hate incident is where someone has been called names, been bullied or been physically hurt just because they may be from a different country, have a different skin colour, have a different religion or belief, they like boys more than girls or girls more boys, have a disability or are different in other ways. When we fight hate we work to make a safer, kinder world for all of us.

## **Competition Rules**

- 1. The competition is open to all key stage 2 students in participating schools. The theme of the competition is "Fight Against Hate Crime".
- 2. Entries should be upto A3 size paper and mounted prior to submission.
- 3. Each entry to be submitted should be photographed **before it is mounted** and a high resolution image of the entry will also be required to be emailed to <u>jiten.patel@open.ac.uk</u>.
- 4. All participating schools must have **registered interest** in participating **by 5pm on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2017**. (A template form will be made available and can be emailed back to ........)
- 5. Each participating school should select and submit up to 7 entries to the Poster competition.
- 6. Use one form per entry (Template will be forwarded to participating schools). Photocopies of the entry form are acceptable.
- 7. All entries must be submitted to the Campaign Steering Group by 30<sup>th</sup> June 2017, (address tbc).
- 8. Judging will take place in the week commencing 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2017.
- 9. There will be up to 20 finalists who will be notified in the week commencing 10<sup>th</sup> July.
- 10. All submitted entries be exhibited at the Open University Library from 12<sup>th</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> July 2017.
- 11. Finalists, together with one parent/carer/guardian plus a school representative, will be invited to a prize giving event, at the Open University on **Wednesday 19**<sup>th</sup> **July 2017**. Timings to be confirmed. There will be impressive prizes for the 3 most impressive entries.
- 12. The submitted entries will be judged by a panel of independent and impartial people.
- 13. All entries are treated confidentially.
- 14. Entries will not be returned, but may be collected by the respective school representative at the end of the prize-giving event on 19<sup>th</sup> July 2017.
